About the Forum

It is critical to keep in mind that clinical discussions are to provide <u>advice only</u> and are not to be construed as a consultation or a directive for care.
 Mentors' Community Forum - a closed space for Mentors in Adaptive Mentoring Networks (i.e., Mentees are not able to view this forum). The Mentor's Forum is space to ask questions about mentoring and support your colleagues as they get started and grow in their mentoring roles. It is a space in which mentors can share advice, resources and teaching materials.
Goals for the Forum
The Forum is designed to be a secure and valued clinical resource for all participants. It strives to: 1. Encourage spontaneous dialogue among participants. 2. Cultivate a safe space that promotes vibrant and meaningful discussions. 3. Grow the Forum to[# goal] national users by[Date]
By focusing on these objectives, the Forum aims to enhance collaboration, knowledge-sharing, and community engagement within the clinical community.
About the Champions The Forum Champions are asked to work a <u>maximum</u> of X hours per month. If more support is needed, new Champions will be identified by the CEP and program staff without increasing individual time commitments. Regular monitoring done by the Champion, the Org , and other program staff will ensure program needs are met efficiently.

The core activity for the Forum Champion will be to support the National Adaptive Mentoring Forums, with focus on:

 - a. Content can be repurposed from other sources, including other discussion forums, social media such as Twitter, etc.
 - b. Focus on content that promotes clinical content that seeks to engage mentors and mentees
 - c. Sharing resources
 - d. Adding to discussions already under way
- 2. Moderating discussions on the Clinical Discussions Forum
- 3. Sharing resources on the resource repository of the Clinical Discussions Forum and monitoring resources added by others
- 4. Working with the national group to bring on members in their respective provinces
- 5. Participate in regular Forum Champions meetings as scheduled
 - a. The Adaptive Mentoring Forum Champion is encouraged to attend regular team meetings with the [Org] and its advisors.
